POSITION DESCRIPTION:

1. Serves as program manager for logistics with responsibility for change of command man-days, food service, Organization Clothing Equipment (OCE), class IX, depot level repairable, general services administration lease vehicle program, full time dining facility operations, petroleum/oil/lubricants and medical supply. The DOL recommends stock levels for installation supply authorized stockage, develops logistics plans, operates the logistics emergency cell, provides overall logistics readiness assessment to support federal and state missions, improves equipment and maintenance units readiness and is the overall logistics funds program manager for all logistics accounts and functions, less aviation. DOL provides logistics technical and administrative advice to the Chief of Staff, commanders and staff officers, on command property accountability, fiscal matters, overall logistics readiness planning, organizational planning, support operations, and staffing for all levels of logistics programs. Participates in major command conferences affecting logistics programs. Serves as primary point of contact to Army commands, National Guard Bureau staff, USPFO and IDT/AT Sites (to include OCONUS) in matters pertaining to logistics planning and operations.
2. Provides logistics management for long/short range planning, logistics and proficiency training, human resource direction, planning, programming, budgeting and execution of funds. Formulates directives, serves on policy boards, financial and readiness management committees and other committees as directed by the Chief of Staff. Independently develops and implements logistic policy for ARNG units and maintains ongoing coordination with the USPFO on policy matters. Provides management and oversight of GSA Lease Vehicle program in support of units/activities of the State. Manages logistics operations through Inter-Service Support Agreements (ISSA), both as a provider and receiver, as approved by the USPFO. Manages Cooperative Agreements (CA) within the DOL support areas as required in support of logistics programs of the State. Maintains oversight of the State's Lost, Damaged and Destroyed (LDD) Property Program. Based on trend analysis, the TAG, COS and Commanders recommendations for corrective action. Responsible for military convoy and movements program in support of DOD services requiring support within the State. Provides management oversight of the command and installation maintenance management plan and staff oversight of surface maintenance shops.
3. Develops and executes the overall logistics and command logistics funding plan in concert with TAG and USPFO. Validates supply, services and maintenance budgets. Receives fiscal information from each subordinate function to prepare and formulate budget estimates for the logistical funding plan. Evaluates the effect of new programs on funding requirements and directs the preparation of justification for budget review. Advises and directs functional program managers regarding allocation of logistic related funds. Plans, develops and coordinates logistic program operating budget in all logistic fiscal accounts. Conducts conferences to outline priorities and collaborate on budget impact caused by increased costs, changes in programs and facilities, mission/weapon system changes and requirements for facilities. Administers and

monitors logistics funding programs in coordination with the USPFO. Directs logistical programs and continually reviews logistics financial position to ensure fiscal integrity. Directs changes to ensure proper timing and accomplishment of objectives.

4. Responsible for logistical mobilization and readiness planning. Directs command equipment transfers throughout the state to improve unit readiness in concert with the readiness committee and the USPFO. Responsible for ensuring unit excess is kept at or below NGB goals. Plans and directs logistic requirements for new equipment training. Establishes goals, objectives and policies for logistic functions. Plans and directs logistic support for training exercises and operations as required. Coordinates and directs the loan of equipment outside the state as approved by the USPFO. Participates in all committees that involve logistic readiness.
5. Responsible to establish and activate the logistics emergency operations cell to support the STARC Emergency Operations Center to support Federal/State missions. Ensures the composition of the logistics operations team includes all functional areas.
6. Directs/coordinates staff visits and inspections of units to determine adequacy of required facilities, effectiveness of logistical support programs and to ensure coordination. Reviews inspection reports (IG/CLRT/COMET/MAIT/Internal Reviews) and ensures corrective action is initiated, implemented, and completed.
7. Evaluates accomplishment of the Command Logistics Discipline Program to assure that systems and programs are functioning properly, there is effective utilization of logistical assets and that training projects and mission requirements are accomplished within established deadlines. Assures adequate training for combat service support units. Adjusts major scheduling of projects to meet changing requirements. Evaluates and assures results of equipment surveys and cost feasibility studies are consistent with the latest technical developments and needs of the state. Ensures unit participation in logistics awards programs, Chief of Staff of the Army Supply Excellence, Chief of Staff of the Army Maintenance, Connelly Food Service Program, National Defense Transportation Association Reserve Component Unit and Individual Award Program.
8. Directs and controls functions related to supply and services, logistic policy, plans, operations and surface maintenance. Oversees logistical readiness and maintenance & supply assistance programs to ensure efficient operation. Makes work assignments within the DOL staff. Serves as the TAG's principal manager for the logistics portion of the management controls program plan, identifying weakness from trend analysis, recommending and implementing changes to correct noted weaknesses. Evaluates, counsels, and advises subordinates. Resolves formal and informal complaints and problems. Ensures adequate staffing of positions and that positions are properly described and classified. Evaluates performance and reviews evaluations made by subordinate supervisors. Reviews disciplinary cases and recommends courses of action. Coordinates through HRO and MILPO on personnel matters. Ensures manpower resources are available for logistic support and oversees command logistics Active Duty Special Work (ADSW) program.

9. Implements management controls program for logistics operations. Oversees logistics programs to ensure compliance with environmental policies and requirements.

10. Performs other duties as assigned.
