Position: Aviation Safety Officer

Description: Serves as the Facility Aviation Safety Manager for DCNG Army Aviation Support Facility (AASF) Fort Belvoir, Virginia. Responsibilities cover the full range of aviation safety requirements involved in the operation and maintenance of an aviation facility and aircrew training plan. Assignment requires coordination with the Federal Aviation Administration, and installation environment authorities, investigation boards, and specialists such as medical, fire prevention, security, and industrial hygiene personnel. Organizes, develops, and conducts the aviation safety program for AASF and tenant units. Reviews, interprets, and disseminates policies and directives relative to aviation safety. Reviews procedures in use or proposed for the use of airfield, heliports, and helipads to ensure aviation safety standards are met. Reviews all Safety of Flight messages and takes action regarding safety requirements. Prepares recurring and special reports. Conducts or participates in special reports and studies. Conducts regular surveys and inspections of but not limited to aviation operations, facilities, and equipment. Incumbent identifies hazards and unsafe conditions and practices; reviews records and technical publications to assure flight safety programs are complete; and develops and recommends changes or corrections to control or prevent hazards critical to the resolution of safety and occupational health management problems. Investigates aircraft mishaps. Interviews witness and completes fact finding inquiries. Analyzes information and reports findings, identifying causes, methods, and techniques to reduce, eliminate, or control the hazards and minimize the potential of recurrence. Serves as expert technical consultant and advisor to SAAO, facility commander, and unit commanders. Performs other duties as required.

Special Remarks:

**Prerequisites:

- 1) Qualified Aviator and Warrant Officer (W2-W4) in the Army, Army National Guard or Army Reserve.
- 2) Be an Army rated helicopter pilot in command with safety track.
- 4) Expert knowledge to all applicable regulations and HQDA related guidance pertaining to Aviation Safety.
- 5) UH-60 or UH-72 qualified.

Qualifications:

- 1. Must be able to retain a SECRET security clearance.
- 2. Must meet physical fitness standards in IAW AR 600-9.

- 4. Must Be MOS qualified.
- 5. Must have leadership and supervisory experience.

Eligibility Requirements:
